To ensure the developments of Lithuanian lifelong learning system correspond to the needs of the economy as well as national and international initiatives



18 Sectoral Professional Committees (1)

1. Accommodation, catering and travel arrangement services, sports activities, entertainment and recreation organization;
2. Wholesale and retail trade;
3. Financial and insurance activities, accounting, bookkeeping and auditing, real estate affairs;
4. Mining, electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply, water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation activities;
5. Creative, arts and entertainment activities, libraries, archives, museums and other cultural activities;
6. Manufacture of wood and products of wood, furniture, paper and paper products;
7. Manufacture of petroleum products, chemicals and chemical products, pharmaceuticals and pharmaceuticals, rubber and plastic products, other non-metallic mineral products;
8. Manufacture and repair of basic metals and metal products, computer, electronic and optical products, electrical equipment, motor and other vehicles, machinery and equipment;



18 Sectoral Professional Committees (2)

9. Service administration, servicing, organisations and agencies activities;
10. Printing, publishing, production and broadcasting of television and radio programs, information services, advertising and market research;
11. Construction, architectural, engineering and related technical consultancy;
12. Education, research and development;
13. Manufacture of textiles, clothing and leather goods;
14. Telecommunications, computer programming, consultancy and related activities;
15. Transport and storage services;
16. Public administration, defense, justice and judicial activities, public order and defense, fire services;
17. Agriculture, forestry, fishing and food production;
18. Human health and social work activities, hairdressing and other beauty treatment.



Sectoral Professional Committees (Law on VET)



Sectoral Vocational Committee - a co-operative advisory body that coordinates the strategic issues of qualification system formation and vocational training in a specific sector of the economy



The main functions of Sectoral Professional Committees

1. Approves Sectoral qualifications standards;
2. Evaluates vocational training programs or their modules;
3. Participates in the external evaluation of VET providers providing formal VET and VET programs;
4. In accordance with its competence, considers and submits proposals to the Ministry of Education, Science and Sport of the Republic of Lithuania regarding qualifications of levels I – VIII of the Lithuanian Qualifications Framework (titles, levels, assessment, award, etc.).
5. Resolves the issues of formation of qualification system and vocational training provided for in other legal acts in a specific sector of the economy.



Composition of sectoral professional committees (1)

1. The composition of the sectoral professional committees includes representatives of the relevant ministries by economic sector, social partners, representatives of vocational training and study institutions.
2. Social partners - employees' representatives and employers' representatives and their organizations.
3. The sectoral professional committee shall consist of at least 9 representatives.



Composition of sectoral professional committees (2)

4. At least half of the members of each sectoral professional committee should represent the employers.
5. To each sectoral professional committee the Ministry of Education, Science and Sport, the Ministry of the Economy and Innovation and the relevant ministries by economic sector delegates the members.
6. The composition of sectoral professional committees shall be updated at least every 5 years.
